


The Harrisburg University of Science and Technology

HISTORY

- The Department of Homeland Security, U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (DHS-USICE), approves Harrisburg University as an institution eligible for the Student and Exchange Visitor Information System (SEVIS).
- First new comprehensive University created in Pennsylvania since 1902
- Chartered by the PA Department of Education in 2005
- Pioneer Class of 73 degree students enrolled in 2005-06
- Started with 5 undergraduate programs
- Middle States Commission on Higher Education accreditation awarded in June 2009

UNIVERSITY FAST FACTS

- In spring 2015, HU offers **28** undergraduate and **18** graduate programs; all focused on science, technology, math and business. HU's programs connect to Pennsylvania's priority industries.
- Professional certifications are available in project management, nanotechnology, computer science, environmental science, food quality assurance, software development, network security, and geospatial technology.
- Four University Centers: Center for Advance Educational and Learning Technologies, Sensory Science Center, Geospatial Technology Center, Government Technology Institute. More than 350 Pennsylvania Commonwealth professionals per year attend HU professional development programs.
- In spring 2015, HU enrolled **345** undergraduate students, 1180 graduate students, and 540 non-degree students.
- In spring 2015, **49%** of HU's undergraduate students will be women, and **45%** will be minorities. The national average is only 12% women and 8% minority in science and technology programs.
- HU has a campus in Philadelphia, and enrolls more than **150** undergraduate students from the Philadelphia school district.
- HU has **220** students living in University housing in spring 2015. On average each student spends \$8,000 per academic year on food in downtown Harrisburg. The HU students contribute more than \$1.75 million each year to the economy of Central Pennsylvania.
- HU currently supports 3 start-up companies (one cloud-computing, two gaming). HU has been awarded a multi-year grant to greatly expand the interactive media industry in Pennsylvania.
- HU has 26 articulation agreements with community colleges that include transfer of all **60** credits for an associate's degree. This keeps the cost of education as low as possible.
- HU undergraduate annual tuition is \$23,900 (\$5400 less than average private PA university); average undergraduate student out-of-pocket tuition expense is \$4100 per year, average student debt upon earning a degree is \$22,000 (\$6,000 less than the national average student educational debt load)
- HU places **92%** of its graduates in family sustaining career positions or in graduate schools within 6 months of earning a degree.
